**Know all men** by these presents that I Joseph Windever father of Joseph Windever late of Basingstoke in the Diocese of Winton collar maker deceased intestate for diverse good causes and considerations me thereunto moving, do renounce all my right and title to the letters of administrations of the goods and chattels of my said son deceased and do desire that the same may be granted and committed to William Windever only brother of the said deceased, and that this my renunciation may take its first and due effect I do nominate Charles Treffles public notary one, of the proctors of the Consistory Court of Winton my true and lawful proctor to exhibit this my renunciation and to desire the same to be admitted and enacted. **In witness** whereof I have hereto set my hand and seal this eighteenth day of June in the year of Our Lord one thousand six hundred ninety and four.
